Frank was born in Brooklyn, NY on January 12th, 1929

Frank entered the United States Army in July 1945 to 1947 and reenlisted on 8 July 1950 and was discharged on July 7, 1953 Frank was an Infantryman Frank had received the Korean Service Medal and the Army Good Conduct Medal and the United Nations Service Medal.

Upon return to Civilian life Frank had become a police officer with the New York City Police Department and attained

the Rank of Lieutenant. Frank was also a member of the Pike County Sheriff's Department and a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars Post 8612, a member of the Emerald Society, a life member of the Catholic War Veterans, Knights of Columbus.

Frank was Married to Grace (Pat) Marr, and had 5 children, (Patricia Renzo and her husband Salvatore, Theresa Yackel and husband Robert, Frank and his wife Melissa, Daniel and his wife Catherine, Michael and his wife Diana.) He was predeceased by his parents, Francis P Hart, His mother Katherine O'Brien and his 2 brothers Daniel and William. He also had 2 sisters that predeceased him Catherine Hall and Mary Hart.

Frank had moved and lived in the Matamoras and was a member of the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the United States at Mountain Laurel post 8612. He was an active member and held the position of Sergeant at Arms from 1998 until 2007
